Inherent Requirements for Bachelor of Nursing HED007 - Student Fact Sheet



These inherent requirements apply to: HED007: Bachelor of Nursing (BoN)

INTRODUCTION

Inherent requirements are the essential components of a course or unit that demonstrate the abilities, knowledge and skills to achieve the core learning outcomes of the course or unit, while preserving the academic integrity of the institute's learning, assessment and accreditation processes. The inherent requirements are the abilities, knowledge and skills needed to complete the course that must be met by all students.

Inherent requirements are therefore essential in becoming a registered nurse and may be used to assess any conditions or disabilities, and make reasonable adjustments. While on placement, you will experience the same situations and tasks as a registered nurse, and some will require specific mental and physical skills and abilities.

The Australian Disability Clearinghouse on Education and Training (ADCET) states: The inherent or essential requirements are those that students must pass in order to complete a course/unit/program. They are those components, which if removed or substituted would substantially impact on the learning outcomes.

TAFE Queensland has obligations under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (Cth), the Anti-Discrimination Act 1991 (QLD) and the Disability Standards for Education 2005 (Cth) to ensure that reasonable adjustments are available. **Students with a disability or chronic health condition may be able to have reasonable adjustments made to enable them to meet these requirements.**

Reasonable adjustment is a term used in the education and employment sectors to refer to any modification made to the learning environment, certification requirements, educational delivery or assessment method to help learners with disability access and participate in education on the same basis as those without disability. An adjustment is reasonable if it balances the interests of all parties affected. TAFE Queensland cannot guarantee industry will be able to accommodate a student's specific support requirements or needs, for their individual circumstance.

Adjustments must be reasonable and cannot compromise the academic integrity of a course. Reasonable adjustments assist students in achieving the inherent requirements and are not a substitute for them. TAFE Queensland is committed to making reasonable adjustments to teaching and learning, assessment, clinical practice and other activities to enable students to participate in their course. Reasonable adjustments must not fundamentally change the nature of the inherent requirement. Students are required to undertake activities which reflect the Australian health care context which may include mixed gender, religious and culturally diverse environments.

TAFE Queensland's capacity to accommodate eligible requests is subject to the availability of placements provided to TAFE Queensland and/or healthcare facility limitations.

To support potential and current students' decision making, a series of inherent requirement statements have been developed. These statements specify the course requirements of the undergraduate nursing course for student admission and progression. The statements are clustered under eight domains consisting of ethical behaviour, behavioural stability, legal, communication, cognition, sensory abilities, strength and mobility and sustainable performance.

HOW TO READ THE INHERENT REQUIREMENT STATEMENTS

If you are intending to apply for admission into the Bachelor of Nursing at TAFE Queensland, you should review these inherent requirement statements and think about whether you may experience challenges in meeting these requirements.

If you think you may experience challenges for any reason including a disability, chronic health condition, you should discuss your concerns with the <u>Student Support or AccessAbility Officer</u> or the Course Coordinator. These staff can work collaboratively with you to determine reasonable adjustments to assist you to meet the inherent requirements in this Course. In the case where it is determined that inherent requirements cannot be met with reasonable adjustments, TAFE Queensland can provide guidance regarding other study options.

These inherent requirements should be read in conjunction with other information, including the course rules and Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia publications, such as:

- Guidelines for Mandatory Notifications
- Professional Boundaries for Nurses
- National Competency Standards for the Registered Nurse.

The inherent requirements are made up of the following five components and domains:

- Level 1 introduction to the inherent requirement
- Level 2 description of the inherent requirement
- Level 3 explanation of why this is an inherent requirement of the course
- Level 4 the nature of any adjustments that may be made to allow you to meet the requirement
- Level 5 examples of things you must be able to do to show you've met the requirement these are examples only and not a comprehensive list

There are nine domains of inherent requirements in the Bachelor of Nursing. Some domains have a number of sub-domains.

- Ethical behaviour
- Behavioural stability
- Legal
- Communication
- Cognition
- Safe Practice
- Sensory ability
- Strength and mobility
- Sustainable performance

1	Nursing involves compliance with safe practice sufficient to meet patient care needs, including considerations of current scope of practice, workplace health and safety and infection control. Nursing also involves compliance with NSQHS National safety quality health service standards	
2	Student demonstrates ongoing knowledge and compliance with Australian Law, professional regulations and scope of practice.	
3	Justification of inherent requirement: Compliance with current scope of practice, workplace health and safety, infection control considerations and effective and timely response to alarm systems are required to provide safe environments for students, staff and others.

5	 Exemplars: Limit task performance to current scope of practice; Comply with relevant workplace health & safety policies for equipment use and storage; Remain up to date with first-aid and CPR knowledge and practice; Work safely with clients with infectious diseases and with reduced immunity; Be able to respond to alarm systems to maintain safety and/or effective health management for self and patients. 	

SENSORY ABILITY*

This course requires adequate visual, auditory and tactile abilities. Adjustments specific to the individual can be discussed with the <u>Student Support or AccessAbility Officer</u> or Course Coordinator

STRENGTH & MOBILTY*

This course requires strength and mobility involving fine and gross motor skills. Adjustments specific to the individual can be discussed with the <u>Student Support or AccessAbility Officer</u> or Course Coordinator

Gross Motor

Inherent requirement statements		
1	Nursing involves physical demands and requires gross motor function.	
2	Student demonstrates the ability to perform gross motor skills to function within scope of practice.	
3	Justification of inherent requirement: Sufficient gross motor skills are necessary to perform, coordinate and prioritise care. Tasks that involve gross motor skills include lifting, carrying, pushing, pulling, standing, twisting and bending. Students must be able to demonstrate and perform these tasks consistently and safely to reduce the risk of harm to self and others	
4	Adjustments should facilitate functional effectiveness, safety of self and others and a capacity to provide appropriate care.	
5	 Exemplars: Maintaining balance while safely mobilising and transferring individuals or resources Able to safely retrieve and utilise stock and equipment 	

Fine Motor

Inherent requirement statements		
1	Nursing is a profession that requires manual dexterity and fine motor skills.	
2	Student demonstrates the ability to use fine motor skills to provide safe effective care.	
3	Justification of inherent requirement: Sufficient fine motor skills are necessary to perform, coordinate and prioritise care. Tasks that involve fine motor skills include being able to grasp, press, push, turn, squeeze and manipulate various objects and individuals. Students must be able to demonstrate and perform these tasks consistently and safely to reduce the risk of harm to self and others	
4	Adjustments should facilitate functional effectiveness, safety to self and others and a capacity to provide appropriate care.	
5	 Exemplars: Performing an aseptic wound dressing Able to prime, accurately insert and set prescribed rate on an infusion device 	

SUSTAINABLE PERFORMANCE*

Adjustments specific to the individual can be discussed with the <u>Student Support or AccessAbility Officer</u> or Course Coordinator

1	Nursing practice requires both physical and mental performance at a consistent and sustained level.
2	 Student demonstrates: Consistent and sustained level of physical energy to complete a specific task in a timely manner and over time The ability to perform repetitive activities with a level of concentration that ensures a capacity to focus on the activity until it is completed appropriately The capacity to maintain consistency and quality of performance throughout the designated period of time
3	Justification of inherent requirement: Sufficient physical and mental endurance is an essential requirement needed to perform multiple tasks in an assigned period to provide safe and effective care
4	Adjustments must ensure that performance is consistent and sustained over a given period.
5	 Exemplars: Participating in tutorials, lectures, skills Provide consistent care over a negotiated time frame
