Higher Education Re-Admission Fact Sheet - Student



TYPES OF RE-ADMISSIONS

This fact sheet is to be used by applicants who are seeking to be re-admitted into a TAFE Queensland Higher Education Course. Re-admission occurs in the following circumstances:

- a. You deferred your offer and now want to start your studies after your deferral period.
- b. You recently either let your offer lapse or you declined it.
- c. You took a break from your studies and were not on an approved leave of absence.
- d. You were excluded or suspended from study.

If you are returning to study after an approved leave of absence, you do not need to apply for re-admission (unless you are returning sooner than the approved period - please refer to the early Return to Study Form from your faculty).

APPLICATIONS

The relevant regional Admissions Officer will return **incomplete applications** such as those that are missing documentation or are otherwise lacking in detail requested in the application form. Applications will not be processed until all documentation is received by the regional Admissions Officer.

PROFESSIONAL REGISTRATION

For re-admission into a Course accredited by a professional body, you will need to demonstrate compliance with the current requirements for the accredited Course. For example:

The Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency requirements for re-admission into the Bachelor of Dental Prosthetics:

- a. Criminal history registration standards
- b. English language skills standards
- c. Health impairment
- d. Vaccinations and immunisations
- e. Inherent Requirements refer to the Course web brochure or Course handbook for course specific requirements)

For Courses that include immersive clinical practice requirements you may be required to:

- a. complete a clinical challenge before you can recommence your studies and/or
- b. undertake additional work and/or
- c. repeat a Unit/s of Study which had been completed prior to the interruption of your study

The Course Coordinator will discuss the Course specific requirements with you when as part of your return to study planning.

EXCEPTIONS TO RE-ADMISSION

Please note: Your application for re-admission into a Course will be declined in the following circumstances:

- a. You are unlikely to be able to complete the Course within the maximum time limits for completing the Course;
- b. The Course is being taught out by TAFE Queensland and you cannot reasonably be expected to complete the Course in the established teach out period;
- c. You have been excluded on academic and/or disciplinary (non-academic) grounds and the exclusion period is still current;
- d. You are unable to demonstrate current knowledge or comply with current Course and/or professional registration and entry requirements (for lapsed enrolment applicants and for excluded/previously excluded/suspended students).

MAXIMUM TIME LIMITS TO COMPLETE A COURSE

The period refers to elapsed calendar years starting from the semester and year in which admission to the course commenced and is inclusive of periods of leave of absence, discontinuation or exclusion. Exceptions to this may be considered where currency of practice and knowledge is able to be evidenced. Time for completion may be reduced if you have advanced standing.

Maximum time limits for course completion (excluding advanced standing) are:

- Undergraduate certificates, equivalent to half a year of full-time study maximum time 2 years
- Associate degrees, equivalent to two years of full-time study Maximum time 5 years
- Bachelor degrees, equivalent to three years of full-time study Maximum time 8 years
- Post graduate certificates, equivalent to 0.5 year of full-time study Maximum time 2 years
- Post graduate diplomas, equivalent to one year of full-time study Maximum time 3 years
- Masters (Coursework), equivalent to two years of full-time study Maximum time 6 years

EVIDENCE REQUIRED

The following information will help you to complete your form to give you the best opportunity to re-commence in your Course. The suggested evidence depends on the type of re-admission applicant you are. Use this section as a checklist to assist you to provide all the required information.
