“Can I join the SEE program?”

We are so excited to welcome you to the TAFE Queensland family. Our team will do everything we can to make these first steps as easy for you as possible.

Please note that there are some entry requirements for the SEE program. Participants need to be:

- an Australian citizen, or
- a permanent visa holder, or
- on a provisional or temporary visa with working rights and eligible for the Adult Migrant English Program, or
- a Pacific Australian Labour Mobility visa holder

and:

- aged 15 years* and over and left school, and
- need help with your reading, writing, Maths, English language or digital skills.

** If you are under 16 or have not yet completed Year 10, you must hold an approved exemption from compulsory schooling.*

“How do I sign up?”

There are a few different ways of applying to the SEE program.

- If you are a registered job seeker, you can contact your Workforce Australia provider to submit a referral on your behalf.
- If you are applying directly, you can visit tafeqld.edu.au/see and click **Submit an Application**.
- You can also visit the Customer Service Centre at your local TAFE Queensland campus and ask to join the SEE program.

“Is this short course or Certificate available?”

All courses listed in this guide are subject to availability and placements in this term's courses cannot be guaranteed.

To join our industry-specific courses (such as a Certificate II in Hospitality, as an example), you must have English and Maths skills at a certain level, to set you up for success.

As such, you may be required to attend general SEE classes (Skills for Your Future) before moving into industry-specific training.

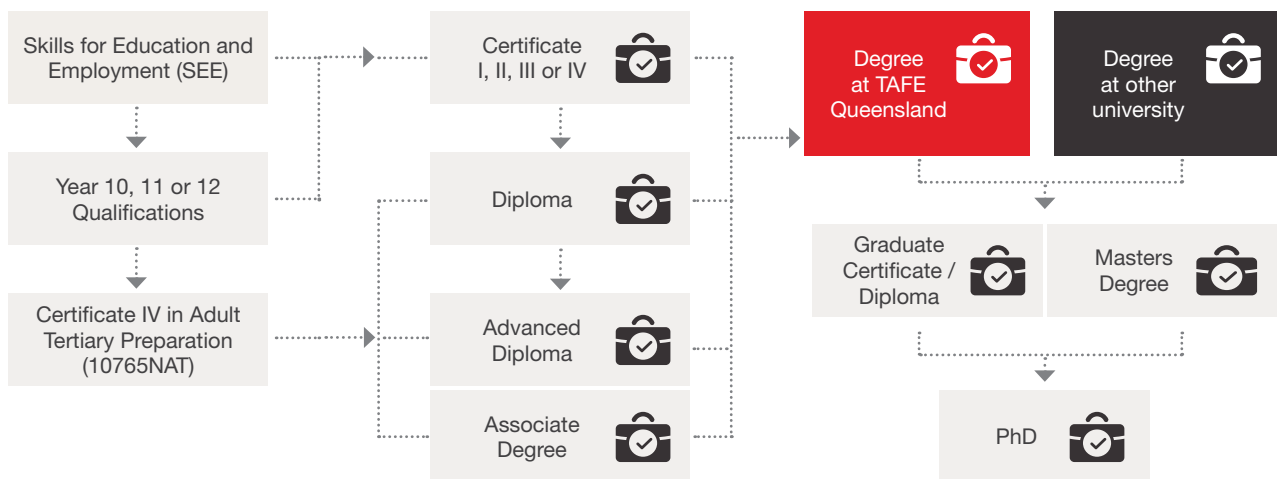

These placements offered valuable opportunities for students to apply their learning in real-world settings, build confidence, and develop practical workplace skills.

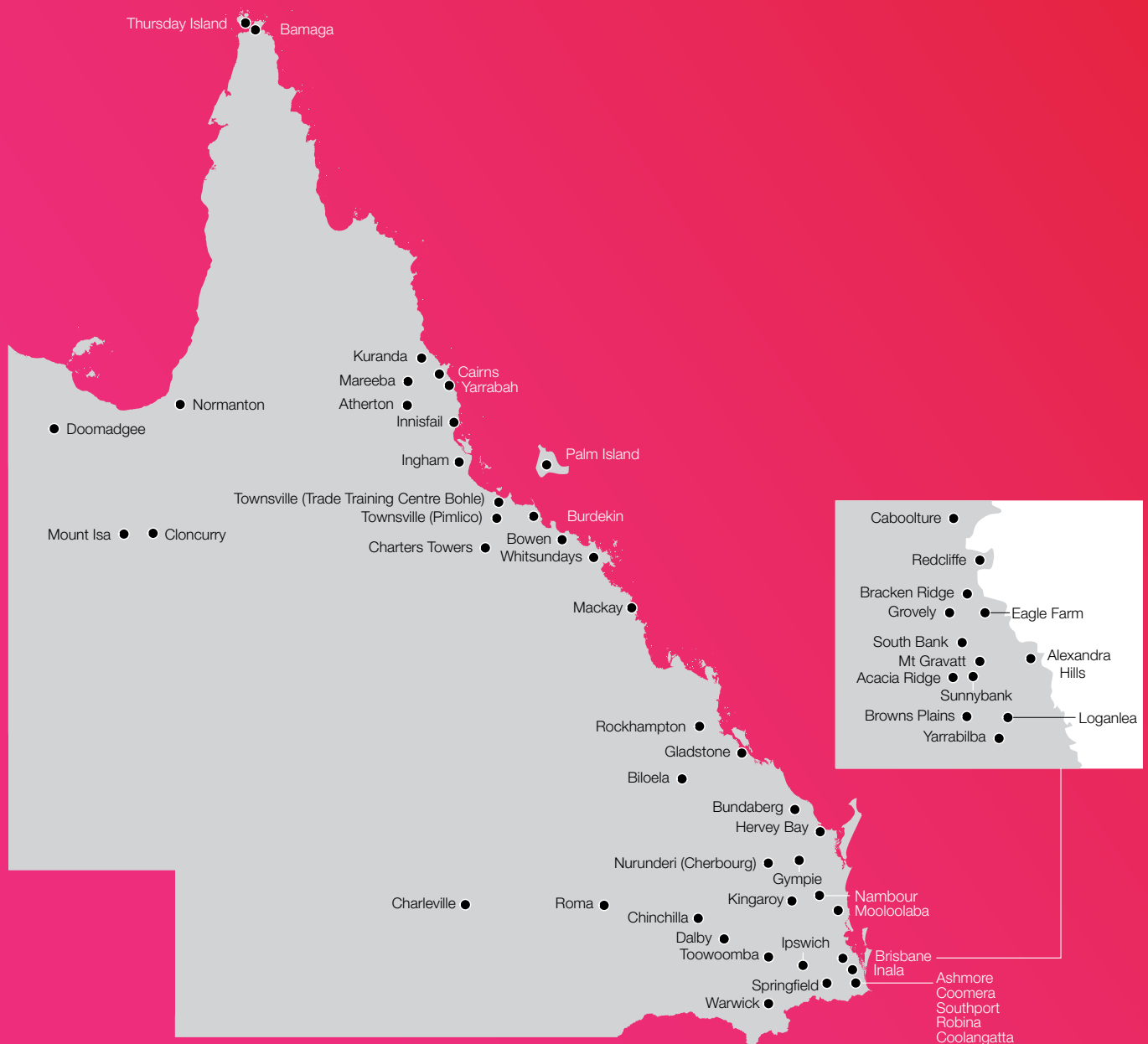

If you want to work in the construction industry, you are required by law to successfully complete a General Construction Induction course. This course meets the requirements of the 2011 Workplace Health and Safety Regulation and covers the skills and assessment necessary for a worker to safely enter and work on a construction site in Queensland.

This accredited skill will give you an understanding of health and safety legislative requirements in order to work safely and prevent injury or harm to yourself and others. Learn how to identify and report common construction hazards, understand basic risk control measures, and identify procedures for responding to potential incidents and emergencies. You'll also cover how to correctly select and fit common personal protective equipment (PPE) used for construction work.

Upon successful completion of this course, you will be issued with a General Construction Induction Card and be able to safely work in the construction industry.

Part 1: Create the Placement

This page covers the key steps to creating a SEE placement on the Workforce Australia Online for Providers system.

- 1** Search for and display your participant from either the home screen or **Caseload** screen and display the **Participant summary** screen.
 - 2** Select **Placements** from the left-hand navigation menu. The **Placements** screen will display.
 - 3** Click **Add a placement** under **Provider activity placements**. The **Add placement** screen will display.
 - 4** Enter and select the **Activity ID** using the details on **Page 21** of this guide. Click **Continue**.
 - 5** The **Additional referral information** screen will display. Complete each question about the individual and their participation in SEE training.
 1. Does this individual meet the eligibility criteria for the SEE program?
 2. Have you explained the SEE program to the individual?
 3. Is the individual willing to participate in the SEE program?
 4. Does the individual have a current participation requirement?
 5. Does the individual have caring responsibilities?
 6. Indicate if the individual requires an interpreter.
 7. Is there any additional information that will assist the SEE provider in assessing and training the individual? Add additional information and click **Continue**.
 - 6** The **Event location** screen will display. Select the event for the placement and click **Continue**.
 - 7** The **Placement details** screen will display. Complete each question as detailed below.
 1. Select 'Expected to Start' from the **Placement status** drop-down list. Once the Pre-Training Assessment is complete, the placement status will be updated automatically.
 2. Select the relevant **Placement type** from the drop-down list. This will be 'Full Time' if the participant has capacity to attend 20 to 25 hours per week, or 'Part Time' if their capacity is between 10 and 19 hours per week.
 3. Enter or select the **Expected start date** for the date the referral is placed with TAFE Queensland.
 4. **Expected end date** can be set to 2 years after the commencement date. TAFE Queensland will update this to align with the client's course details.
 5. Enter any relevant **Comments** (optional). These comments will not be visible to TAFE Queensland.
 6. Click **Continue**.
- ✓ The **Review and submit** screen will display. Check to ensure all details are entered correctly, then click **Submit**. A confirmation message will display.

Part 2: Schedule the Pre-Training Assessment

The Pre-Training Assessment (PTA) serves to determine if SEE training is appropriate for the participant, identify their training needs, and establish baseline capabilities from which to track their progress.

This page covers the key steps to booking a SEE participant's PTA on the Workforce Australia Online for Providers system.

- 1** Navigate to the Participant Summary. Under the Calendar Summary section, click **Create Appointment**.
 - 2** Select 'Consultation' under **Booking type**.
 - 3** Select 'Pre-Training Assessment' under **Consultation type**. Click **Next**.
 - 4** The **Add a consultation** booking screen will display. Select a booking time from the drop-down list.
 - ◆ Available PTA appointment times will be displayed starting from tomorrow and will cover the next 10 days. The appointment duration and times are determined by TAFE Queensland.
 - ◆ Where there is no availability in the system, please contact us using the phone number provided on screen to schedule the Participant's Pre-Training Assessment appointment.
 - 5** Select 'Face-to-face' from the **Event format** drop-down list.
 - 6** Leave **Information for participants** and **Consultant notes** blank. Click **Continue**.
 - 7** Select a **Notification method** from the drop-down list.

The Participant will receive a notification via the selected method with details about their PTA appointment booking.
 - 8** Indicate 'Yes' to the **Acknowledgement**. Click **Next**.
- ✓ The **Review and Submit** screen will display. Check the details and, if correct, click **Submit**.
A confirmation message will display.

- ◆ If there are any changes required to the PTA appointment, contact us to re-schedule or cancel.
- ◆ We will advise you if the PTA is not completed or the participant does not continue onto SEE training.
