TAFE Queensland is a provider of the Skills for Education and Employment (SEE) program, a free skills program built to prepare you for the workforce or further training.

Through SEE, we'll support you to work towards the career of your choice through:

- Reading, writing, Maths, English and digital skills training
- Personal guidance sessions for your future
- Practical short courses, such as RSA and White Card
- Free Certificate I, II and III qualifications
- Essential workplace skills, including health and safety, using business software, and interviewing for jobs
- Work experience placements

Learn for free

That's right: free. This training is fully funded by the Australian Government.

Get qualified

Access up to two years of training in order to complete a course or qualification up to a Certificate III.

Stay focused

From job interview techniques to short courses, you'll learn hands-on skills for the job market.

Meet obligations

Earn 25 points per week towards your mutual obligations for Centrelink.

“Can I join the SEE program?”

We are so excited to welcome you to the TAFE Queensland family. Our team will do everything we can to make these first steps as easy for you as possible.

Please note that there are some entry requirements for the SEE program. Students need to be:

- an Australian citizen, or
 - a permanent visa holder, or
 - on a provisional or temporary visa with working rights and eligible for the Adult Migrant English Program, or
 - a Pacific Australian Labour Mobility visa holder
- and:
- aged 15 years* and over and left school, and
 - need help with your reading, writing, Maths, English language or digital skills.

** If you are under 16 or have not yet completed Year 10, you must hold an approved exemption from compulsory schooling.*

“How do I sign up?”

There are a few different ways of applying to the SEE program.

- You can visit tafeqld.edu.au/see and fill out our application form.
- If you are a registered job seeker, you can contact your Workforce Australia provider to submit a referral on your behalf.
- You can also visit the Customer Service Centre at your local TAFE Queensland campus and ask to join the SEE program.
